



What Happens to Delegates When Candidates Suspend their Campaigns?

For Congressional District Delegates

District-level delegate spots are earned based on the votes cast, regardless of the status of the campaign. These district-level delegate spots are allocated in proportion to the results of the primary vote in the respective congressional districts.

Delegates are allocated and the delegate candidates complete for delegate slots at the congressional district conventions on March 21.

County Conventions hold caucuses on March 7 for all candidates that have earned delegates, regardless of the status of the campaign.

Delegates who filed in support of candidates who did not earn delegates cannot run for a delegate position. **These delegate candidates can participate at their county convention by pledging their support to any candidate that has earned delegates, can become a selector in that caucus, and participate at the Congressional District Convention by voting for delegates in that caucus.**

For At-Large and PLEO Delegates

At-Large and PLEO delegates will be elected on April 18 by the TNDP State Executive Committee.

At-Large and PLEO delegates and PLEOS are allocated to those presidential candidates that meet the 15% threshold based on statewide results. If a presidential candidate who earned delegates is no longer a candidate before the At-Large and PLEO delegates are elected, their share of these delegates and alternates is proportionately divided among the remaining candidates who have also met the statewide threshold.

The deadline to file for an At-Large or PLEO delegate position is March 27, Noon Central.
